Operating under the name Wired which stands for Wirral Information Resource for Equality and Diversity, the organisation aims to help disadvantaged people to live full and independent lives so that they can fully participate in society.

Services include:

- Carer support Wirral Helpline, news bulletin, counselling, carers register, emergency contact service and carers grants. The Carers Helpline aims to help carers by providing emotional/practical support. Furthermore, they provide advice on letting healthcare professionals know that you are a carer, how to continue working flexibly whilst caring and how to check for suitable benefits/extra money that you can claim.
- PALS team: provides a confidential service, helping sort out any concerns that a person may have about the care they are are receiving, providing advice and guiding people through the different services available from the NHS.
- SEND Wirral SEND Partnership is an impartial, independent and confidential service which gives free information, advice and support about matters relating to Special Educational Needs or Disabilities and is for parents or carers of children aged 0-25.
- Shopmobility: a scheme that hires manual and powered wheelchairs and powered scooters to members of the public who have limited mobility.
- Managed Personal budget: A personal budget is funding that is given to people who have been assessed as needing social care. People who might need this support are assessed and the results of the assessment are put in a support plan. The personal budget or direct payment is then used to provide the support listed in the plan.

Age UK Wirral

Age UK Wirral exists to promote the wellbeing of older people on the Wirral, helping to make later life a fulfilling and enjoyable experience. Services include carer support, health & activity classes, cancer patient support and support after being discharged from hospital, amongst many others.

Services include:

- Support after hospital: supports people who have been in hospital or who are at risk of being admitted to hospital. Support includes light housework, shopping and helping with referrals to other agencies. Transport services can help with getting to medical appointments and activities.
- Support people with a falls prevention exercise plan, and can look at ways to reduce risks associated with falling in the home. This may include assistance with occasional gardening or odd jobs to help make home a safer place.
- Health and Activity: based at Meadowcroft in Bromborough, offering an exciting range of physically, mentally and socially stimulating activities.
- Stanhope Court: offers residential accommodation and short term breaks for people with dementia, CQC rated good 31st July 2018.
- Day Care: There are two Elderly Mentally III units for people over 65. One is at the Devonshire Resource Centre, (Monday to Friday) and the other at Meadowcroft Community Wellbeing Hub, (Monday to Saturday), where they have a team of fully qualified professionals delivering a programme of stimulating activities to promote mental wellbeing.
- Phonelink: telephone service, which runs Mondays to Fridays, will give the elderly a regular telephone call for a friendly chat. (Call 0151 482 3456)
- Carer Support Service: Support service for those who care for older people with dementia to try to take some of the strain of caring with emotional and practical support.
- Cold weather army: a service provided by volunteers to help in emergency situations during a cold snap. Volunteers will call to warn about a change in the weather and offer support to stay safe and warm.
- Cancer patient support: working in partnership with Macmillan to provide practical and emotional support to people aged 60+ who have been diagnosed with cancer and are currently receiving treatment.

Inclusion Matters Wirral

Inclusion Matters Wirral offers primary care based psychological interventions proven-to-work for common mental health issues (anxiety, depression and related disorders). It provides a stepped care approach (steps 2 and 3) and a range of interventions recommended by NICE guidance. They also work with those with coexisting problems with drugs and alcohol.

Referral into the service starts with an appointment with the GP. The service user must contact the GP and tell them about how they have been feeling. After visiting a GP, a service user and GP can then decide together to make a referral into Inclusion Matters to try a course of talking therapy. From here a suitable date and time will be made for the service users' appointment. Inclusion Matters offers face-to-face rehabilitation therapy.

Headway Wirral

Headway Wirral is a local charity that works to improve life after brain injury. They provide support, services and information to people with an acquired brain injury, their relatives and carers. They work closely with health and legal professionals and provide guidance on such matters as social services and financial support.

Currently they provide a drop-in service (Tuesdays and Wednesdays), a social group (Thursdays) and a carers group which meets fortnightly.

These sessions takes place every Tuesday from 10.00am - 2.00pm at The Fountain Project, 90 - 92 Chester Street, Birkenhead, Wirral CH41 5DL and every Wednesday from 10.00am - 2.00pm at Meadowcroft, 304 Spital Road, Bromborough, Wirral CH62 2DE.

They also run a social group suitable for group members who have an acquired brain injury. This allows members to meet in a social setting, keep active, enjoy activities, and take part in outings and events.

Once a month, the group enjoy a day out to local places of interest, these trips take place on Thursdays and are generally the first Thursday of the month but can sometimes be altered to accommodate other events.

The carers group meets fortnightly at The Fountain Project, Birkenhead from 11.00am – 12noon.
