

What is Parkinson's?


- it affects nerve cells in the brain
- these cells help control movement
- there is no cure at the moment
- care and treatment helps relieve symptoms



The main symptoms

- tremors and muscle stiffness
- your movement is slow
- talking is affected
- you are more tired
- you can have problems going to the toilet

If you think you have any of these symptoms you should phone your GP.



What do our nurses do?

They will:

- manage your illness
- assess your needs and develop a care plan







How to see us

Your GP will refer you to see a consultant.

If you have Parkinson's you may be referred to one of our nurses.



Your appointment
