Changing Landscape

We welcome the development of Integrated Care Systems (ICS) and a focus on close collaboration at 'Place'. We are proud and privileged to be able to deliver services across three of the nine council areas in Cheshire and Merseyside ICS - Wirral, Cheshire East and St Helens - and are pleased that, in 2022, will also begin providing services in Knowsley.

We are committed to providing locally integrated care, built around individuals and families.

We firmly believe that even closer working between council, NHS, independent and community, voluntary and faith sector partners will enable us, together, to reduce health inequalities, improve population health and provide excellent services.

As we develop our long-term strategy, we aim to continue to bring our unique insight as an integrated provider of health and social care services to keep people healthy and independent in the place they call home.







Population Health and Reducing Inequalities

We are proud to be an NHS provider of integrated health and social care. Preventing ill health and supporting people to live healthy and independent lives is a core focus of our strategic direction.

By using our resources differently, we want to develop asset-based approaches to community health and wellbeing, centred around people and the places they live to address the inequalities that exist within our local populations.

We recognise the fundamental part we play in our local communities, and we want to maximise our social value to improve health and wellbeing by developing local employment opportunities, boosting the local economy and increasing environmental sustainability. We embrace our social responsibility by understanding our population and we want to encourage local people to work with us to better understand their needs.

We hope that in 2020-21 we will achieve the Social Value Quality Mark to demonstrate our commitment and we will support Wirral's Community Wealth Building programme.

Place-based Delivery and Collaboration

We are ambitious to offer more proactive and holistic care in community settings, meeting the national priorities for community providers and collaborating with Primary Care Networks.

As an integrated provider of health and social care we are in a unique position to support effective Population Health Management and integrated service delivery across Cheshire and Merseyside.

In 2021 - 22, we are shaping our community nursing, adult social care and 0-19 teams working at Locality and Primary Care Network level to:

- Better connect with local communities and build teams informed by local population need, making best use of combined community and primary care resources
- Support even more effective place-based care by bringing different professional disciplines under single management structures

At the same time, we are developing system-wide teams.

From September 2021 our intermediate care centre on the Clatterbridge site will become an essential part of the care continuum in Wirral.

We are proud to announce by April 2022 we will be offering a multidisciplinary two hour crisis response to people's urgent care needs, 12 hours a day, 7 days a week.

All these developments will help people stay independent and live well in the place they call home for as long as possible.



Innovation and Quality

Our ambition is to consistently deliver outstanding care, focussing on what matters to people.

As we define our long-term strategy, our approach will continue to focus on Insight, Involvement and Improvement. Building on a history of learning from people's experiences, everything we do will be informed by, and designed with, people who use our services and our partners.

This will help us deliver even safer, more compassionate and effective services that people value and trust.

We will further embed a culture of Continuous Quality Improvement and we will achieve this by trusting, liberating and empowering our staff to innovate and test new ideas.

We will nurture an already established positive safety culture, promoting psychological safety and embedding a just and learning culture through all aspects of our work with people.







People

Our people are our greatest and most valuable resource and we are committed to supporting them to develop, innovate and thrive as part of delivering high quality services. We aim to transform and support our workforce as we move to more integrated teams, developing their skills and competencies to deliver place-based care.

A key aspiration of our long-term strategy is to be recognised as a modern employer, offering flexibility, agile working practices and technology, culture and opportunities to attract great and diverse talent.

We will grow our workforce, providing new career opportunities for our people and putting safety, professionalism, innovation and inclusion at the heart of our plans. More opportunities for volunteering, work experience and routes into employment for everyone, will be vital to ensure our workforce reflects and encourages diversity.

Our people also represent our local population, and we are proud of the social value we can offer as a significant employer in our communities.


