Winter Preparedness **Information for Wirral Care Home Managers**

Health Protection Service









This year, we face a difficult winter with Covid-19 circulating alongside other respiratory viruses, including seasonal flu, and also viral stomach infections (such as norovirus). Being vaccinated and maintaining simple infection prevention and control (IPC) practices will help reduce the spread of respiratory infections and gastrointestinal viruses within care homes.

5 simple steps for managers to keep care homes safe this winter

- Support your staff to get vaccinated for flu and Covid
- Ensure your **staff test** for covid **when symptomatic**
- Support symptomatic and unwell staff to stay at home
- Reinforce the importance of infection prevention and control precautions to all staff
- Review and update your business continuity plan

Prevention measures including hand hygiene, testing, standard IPC precautions, and use of personal protective equipment (PPE), are still essential to stop transmission and prevent outbreaks in care homes. **Managers have a duty of care to keep care home staff and residents safe.**

Be proactive. Take the following actions to protect care home residents and staff this winter:

Educate and reinforce 5 moments of hand hygiene and hand hygiene product choice amongst all staff and remember, during outbreaks of gastrointestinal illness, to promote the use of soap and water as alcohol gel will not kill bugs like norovirus and Clostridioides difficile (C.diff).	~	
Ensure that sufficient personal protective equipment (PPE) is available for staff, placed in appropriate dispensers , and that staff are trained in its safe use and disposal.	~	
Ensure Covid-19 testing kits are available and accessible, stored appropriately and staff are aware of ordering testing kits through the GOV.UK portal.	~	
Ensure staff are competent in obtaining nasopharyngeal swabs (Viral swabs) as per guidance.	~	
Educate and reinforce hand and respiratory hygiene to all staff, residents and visitors.	/

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15	Ensure cleaning and disinfection products are available to include a chlorine-based product (1000 ppm). Increase the frequency and intensity of cleaning for all areas (in increased incidents of infection/outbreak), focusing on shared spaces and frequently touched surfaces. Ensure appropriate linen and waste management systems are in place.	~
16	Consider ventilating rooms after a visit from someone outside the setting, or if anyone in the care setting has suspected or confirmed COVID-19, where possible. The comfort and wishes of the person receiving care should be considered in all circumstances. During severe cold weather, ensure that rooms, particularly living rooms and bedrooms, are kept warm and that staff are taking appropriate action to protect residents.	~
17	Educate staff on early recognition of outbreaks and reporting processes.	/
18	Proactively ask staff if they are feeling well at the beginning of each shift.	/
19	Consider how you would cohort in the event of an infectious disease Outbreak. For example, try to limit staff movement between facilities, where care homes are part of a group, and within settings, if possible.	~
20	Ensure Isolation/Outbreak signage is available and displayed in an Outbreak situation.	/

22	Keep NHS Capacity Tracker updated.	/
23	Encourage staff and residents to keep hydrated*. Consider implementing protected drinks time throughout the day in care homes, display hydration poster in the back of toilets' door and offer hydration leaflets to staff, residents and visitors. Please contact healthprotectionservice@wirral.gov.uk to request printed hydration materials. *(If advised to restrict fluid intake by a healthcare professional follow this advice)	~
24	Ensure you are aware of the cold weather alert system and plans are in place to be activated if needed	~
