<p>This quarterly report provides evidence that learning from deaths is firmly embedded as a priority across the Trust, ensuring full adherence to the NQB Learning from Deaths framework. It provides anonymised details of the numbers of unexpected deaths which have occurred within the Trust throughout Q3 2022/23, along with a summary of thematic learning identified during investigation into these cases.</p> <p>All deaths reported to the Trust in Q3 have flowed through the Trusts governance processes.
