Hydration

With the summer fast approaching let's talk about the importance of staying hydrated...when it is hot, we all need more fluids.

Many people get dehydrated by not drinking enough fluid or by losing fluids and not replacing them. Anyone can become dehydrated, but babies, children and the elderly are most at risk. Encourage little ones to drink regularly, even if they don't feel thirsty. Water is best. Adults are advised to avoid alcohol, tea and coffee as these drinks make dehydration worse.
